

Short Communication

A Short (Brief) Communication reports a concise study of high quality and broad interest. The short manuscripts definitively documenting either experimental results or informative clinical observations will be considered for publication in this category. Brief Reports are not intended to allow publication of incomplete or preliminary findings. The review process is equally rigorous as for Regular Articles and the acceptance rate is lower.

Abstract:

Abstracts must not exceed 70 words and should be a single paragraph (or three sentences) with no subheadings.

Full text:

The full text of a short communication may not exceed 3 printed pages. This format contains the below sections:

- Introduction
- Methods
- A combined Results and Discussion section
- References

In a short communication, the maximum number of:

- Tables or figures are 2
- References are 20(Omit article titles from the reference list)
- Words are 1000-1500 words, including abstract, full text, references and figure legends, and contains no headings.
